ICT Education and English Education

It is said that English education is most suited for ICT.

ICT facilitates the ability to communicate in the five English skills: reading, listening, speaking, presentation, and writing.

For example:

Use the picture of "the main gate of the TTC." By copying this picture, we can draw out the interest of "wanting to explain" and "wanting to listen" and promote communication in English. Also, audio models and videos can be used as reference when learning.

In a usual face-to-face setting, we speak English or other languages without reading a manuscript. We express our ideas and watch out for the facial expressions and body language of the other person with whom we are talking to. In this case, we just speak, listen, and observe intently based on what we hear and see from the person.

On the other hand, if we want to practice English more effectively and make it more engaging, using English presentations would be better to engaging our audience. ICT will be very useful in this case.

Presentation and Structure

Determine the order by which you will present clearly to others. Specific examples should be prepared. This process is called composition, and it is the basis of file production. The use of ICT allows for the use of pictures and graphs. Effective pictures and composition greatly enhance the power of the speaker's voice.

There is always an audience in a presentation. The presentation is always in the presence of the other person, and the "spoken word" is used to call for and deliver the message. Sometimes, you will use pictures and diagrams to convey your message better.

English for Presentations

A presentation is a call to action using the spoken word. It must be developed in the spoken language used in everyday life. Instead of a long, explanatory English, such as

an essay, we should use short, easy-to-understand English. This makes it much easier for the audience to listen to.

Cambodia and Japan are located in Asia. I think there are more occasions to communicate with Asian friends than in the U.S. or U.K., where English is used as a native language.

Build on your presentation

A one-minute presentation conveys one thing. For example, tell what you are studying at Teacher Training College. If you continue to make such presentations, you will eventually be able to give a comprehensive overview of TTC using the "Show and Tell" method.

If you accumulate 30 such presentations in a year, you will be able to talk about TTC in English for 30 minutes in a row.

With the help of pictures and graphs, you will be able to speak effectively and enjoyably.

This ability is an internationally applicable skill. It is the ability to interact with the world in English.

The Power to Interact with the World English Presentation

Many people graduate from school and become elementary school teachers. When teaching a class, the English presentation skills they have learned will enhance the children's ability to speak. You can set an example of confident speech.

Understanding English is not enough to speak English. This is because you can only speak English that you are familiar with. They can only utter words and sentences that they know how to pronounce. Including teachers' grammatical explanations are very good for presentations. Giving an English presentation transforms a classroom into an active learning experience.

Communication with schools around the world is also possible via the Internet.

Children can show pictures of Angkor Wat and introduce their town to audiences abroad. Teachers and students can grow together as they are connected via ICT, hearing voices from around the world, and gaining international knowledge.

Ability to connect and share with the world and ICT

ICT enables students to hear and learn from other students in the same generation around the world. The most significant effect is that ICT brings interaction for students, not only with their teachers, but also with students from other countries. Discussions and even brief self-introductions can be done and recorded. By listening to them many times, students can learn to express themselves through the use of ICT. Above all, the experience of interacting with the world will give them great confidence in their English abilities.

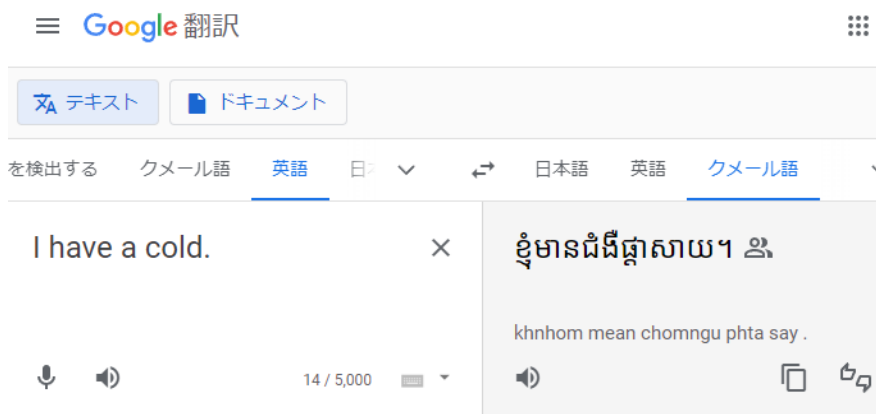

When you speak into the microphone and these words do not come out well, type them by hand, listen to the sound through the speakers, and pronounce them with this sound in mind. Once you get used to it, they will appear correctly with a little practice. You can also try practicing with short sentences.

The most effective and important practice of using ICT in English education to acquire English language skills is doing English presentation. English presentations need to be structured. These should be thought through and proofread in the native language first. The steps are to learn the stories well and pronounce these in English.

The most effective way to convey the content of your presentation is to use words you are familiar with in English and express your own understanding.

In EFL countries, such as Japan and Cambodia, where learning English is foreign, ICT can break language limitations in a more interactive and effective way.

5 sentence patterns in English. The 5 Sentence patterns are:

S + V I study.

S+V+C I am a student.

S+V+C I am a student at PTTC. S+V+O I study

ICT-education. S+V+O+O I gave Thida chocolate.

S+V+O+C I named my pet Milky.

Note: S = subject

V = verb

C = complement

O = object Confirmation Method
